Executive Summary

Masinyusane's flagship Children's Education and Youth Jobs project continued to expand, create employment, and change lives in 2022.

In 2022, we created 251 jobs that benefitted 303 different youth. Over the course of the year, those youth made an enormous difference in schools and creches across the city.

The youth completed a number of workshops, work-readiness programmes, and participated in a career fair we hosted. By equipping them to find further employment, we open up the opportunity for another unemployed youth to join the project. We are proud to share that 24% of the youth found further employment during the course of the year.

The reason we believe this is the best youth jobs programme in the country is the difference the jobs make in the lives of the children. Every literacy session is customized to the child's current level, ensuring maximum impact.

We are building a foundation from which a confident child capable of reading, writing, and comprehending will emerge.

This is life changing work and we thank everyone who has generously contributed towards making it possible.





GOALS

IMPACT

- Our 2-4 year olds know 3X as many phonics as their peers.
- Our 5-6 year olds score 4X higher on independent literacy assessments.
- 87% of our Grade 3's pass a gradelevel writing assessment.

- We had 303 youth working in the programme.
- 1499 children are receiving literacy sessions.

Early Years

The first 5 years of a child's life provide a miraculous moment in time in which you can teach them nearly anything. We strive to have our children hear 1,000 stories before the age of 5.

Children with this much exposure to reading have better memories, bigger vocabularies and more creative imaginations. Unsurprisingly, they learn to read much faster.

We like to say 'Reading is a Super power' and providing children this super power at such a young age is life-changing.






By year 3, children on our programme will have already doubled the early childhood literacy progress of their peers.

PRIMARY SCHOOL YEARS

Masinyusane invests a huge amount into providing children with the reading, writing and comprehension foundation that they need to succeed in school. Grades R through 3 are the most critical formal schooling years in a child's life.

A Generation of Readers

Masinyusane's Literacy Coaches provide customised, individual literacy sessions to children for the first 5-7 years of their schooling life. This provides them with the foundation they need to read, write and comprehend. Every child is unique and learns differently. Even worse, many of our children are packed into classrooms with 40 to 50 children. Our Literacy Coaches provide customised, one-hour literacy sessions designed to work with the child at their level.

This is the most effective, full-proof way of ensuring every child learns and no one is left behind. And we have the data to prove it.

Youth Employment

Masinyusane has pioneered an innovative youth employment programme in the Eastern Cape that we are beginning to see adopted nationally.

We create social impact jobs, targeting women, that entail youth working to educate the children in their own communities. The opportunities to receive one-on-one assistance is valuable in any setting, but doubly so in the overcrowded classrooms of Gqeberha's impoverished public schools.

In return for all the hard work, Masinyusane invests heavily in providing the youth with high quality trainings throughout the year. We complement this with employment assistance, ensuring we create a conveyor belt from unemployment into the formal economy.

Masinyusane has built and runs 19 libraries. While the Literacy Centres teach children 'how to' read and write, the libraries make reading fun. Our library managers run a variety of projects, reading clubs and competitions. They are all designed to get as many children reading as possible.

93% of South African homes have fewer than 10 books, so we are proud to share that over 40,000 books have been taken home by children in 2022.

Masinyusane is pioneering Educational Technology Centres in Port Elizabeth township primary schools. These Centres provide children with the opportunity to develop basic technological literacy skills, to access the world's best educational apps and to learn from countless innovative games. The Centres consist of both laptops and tablets. The laptops cater to the older children who learn to type, navigate Windows, and use Microsoft Office.

The tablets enable the younger children who learn from literacy, math, creative & logic apps. We continue to pilot new programmes, apps and games in our centres. The children test, discover, explore and flex their creative muscles every day.


