

Job creation in the community

Masinyusane is empowering communities to uplift themselves. We recognize that while impoverished, our communities have incredibly talented young people in them. They simply need the opportunity to learn, grow, contribute, and give back.

In 2023 we created 342 jobs for previously unemployed youth to work with children in our schools and preschools. These jobs are life-changing for the youth. For most, it's their first employment opportunity and it gives them the chance to earn an income (bringing much needed money into their homes), obtain workplace experience (critical for their CV), learn new skills, and to give back in their own community.

As pages that follow show, the employment opportunities we provide for youth not only transform their lives but also create a profound and positive impact on the children they work with.

Early Childhood Development

Masinyusane is at the forefront of introducing innovative preschool literacy initiatives, bringing the magic of storytelling in young children's lives.

Our dedicated team is committed to a unique objective: ensuring that every child is exposed to 500 stories a year. This approach is grounded in substantial research, which consistently demonstrates that early exposure to stories significantly enhances academic performance.

Furthermore, we provide personalised literacy sessions for each child, tailored to their individual learning style and level. These sessions develop essential reading skills such as attentive listening, sound recognition, letter identification, and the foundational elements of blending sounds and beginning to read.

Our results are remarkable. Children in our programme outperform their peers in standard reading assessments by an astounding 500%, setting a new benchmark in early childhood literacy development in South Africa.



O2 Primary School Literacy

Masinyusane extends its impactful literacy journey into primary school, where we nurture the vital skills of reading, writing, and comprehension. We will stick with the same child for 4-5 years until they are fluently reading, all the while providing customised literacy sessions tailored to that child's needs and level

Children involved in our core literacy programme consistently outperform their control groups by an impressive margin of 40-50% annually. This significant advantage becomes even more pronounced over time, with children who have participated in our programme for 4-5 years far outpacing their peers.

By fostering a generation of proficient readers, we are not just teaching children to read and write; we are empowering them with the tools for lifelong learning and success. Our programme is more than an educational initiative; it's a gateway to endless possibilities for each child's future.



At Masinyusane, we operate a dynamic, multi-stream model characterized by continuous testing, measurement, and refinement. Our team strives for rapid iteration, consistently enhancing and deploying improved versions of our programmes. A key concept for us is 'programme velocity' – the speed at which we gather data, analyze it, and upgrade our programmes to more effective versions. This agile approach enables us to identify and invest in the streams that demonstrate the most significant impact for the children. Our ethos is one of perpetual motion; we are always learning, improving, and striving for excellence in everything we do. We owe the children nothing less.



In 2023, we partnered with the government and a few leading organisations to roll out a streamlined version of our programme into more government schools. The programme is built to scale. The results were astounding! In just 6 weeks, we taught children as many letter sounds as they typically learned in an entire year. In 2024, we build on that success and begin scaling it up across the nation

Computer Skills & Coding

In 2023, we had over 5,000 children participate in our computer classes and coding programmes. Building digital fluency is a critical skill for children and we are ensuring they are not left behind.





Meet Zintle

We often preach about unlocking the talent that already exists within our communities. This talent can be unleashed to uplift the communities themselves.

When we say that, we are referring to people like Zintle. She worked at eBongweni Primary School, located in a very dangerous and impoverished townships. There is typically very little opportunity for children born there.

Every day, Zintle brought her radiant smile and personality to work and brought hope to the children at eBongweni. With her incredible work ethic, she managed to get two of her children into our Top 10 (out of 1470 children).

In recognition of her incredible achievements, we recently promoted her to take over our new Educational Technology centre there. She is now teaching hundreds of children computer basics and running introductory coding programmes.

She is a testament to our belief that our communities have the talent to uplift themselves. We just have to give them the opportunity.



Siphokazi ran 706 hours of customised, individual literacy sessions with her 12 children this year. They made astounding progress, learning most of their letters, how to identify beginning, middle, and ending sounds, and have started blending sounds to make words.

She also read them over 500 stories over the course of the year. Hearing hundreds of stories is highly correlated to future educational success.

It is not an exaggeration to say her work with each of those twelve children has been life-changing.

Starting Early

Change the trajectory of a ship, by even one degree, and it ends up at a vastly different destination. This is exactly what we are doing with very young children across the Eastern Cape. Our work at Sinethemba is but one example.

Siphokazi, and her colleague Ntombovuyo, have worked magic at Sinethemba Creche. Sinethemba is one of 53 creches Masi youth work in (22 of which have the full-time literacy coaches). Sinethemba is a large shack with no desks, no supplies, and no curriculum.

The 34 children would be sleeping and playing on the ground without the Masi youth there.

Siphokazi's children, aged 3 to 5, have already mastered an average of 21 of their letter sounds. This is an astounding foundation upon which to enter Grade R. For context, children finishing Grade 1 in South Africa know 12 letter sounds.

The children have also heard hundreds of stories over the course of the year.

Multiply the magic we have worked at Sinethemba across dozens of preschools and you begin to see scale and impact of Masinyusane's work.







OUR IMPACT













Masinyusane has built dozens of libraries, literacy centres, classrooms, and computer labs at schools and preschools across the Eastern Cape in South Africa. 2023 was no different.

With a focus on libraries, we are ensuring tens of thousands of children have access to books every day. In 2023, we have sent over 100,000 books with children to impoverished homes that typically do not have any. Our team has also read tens of thousands of stories to children.

Children who hear stories have bigger imaginations, better memories, more expansive vocabularies, and better educational outcomes. We are making sure that every child receives this precious gift.

One day soon I will be a doctor that is saving lives. I hope my story will be an inspiration for other children to follow their dreams.






Masinyusane is providing housing to some of the most impoverished students in Gqeberha.



They will be eternally grateful.






A Generation of Leaders





Masinyusane takes great care to invest our donors' contributions in high impact projects that make a difference. We maintained a project-to-overhead ratio of 94% to 6% in South Africa, ensuring our donors' money is being spent efficiently.

The bulk of the University Students' funding supported **student tuition**, **bus fare**, **and housing**.

The bulk of the Children's Education & Youth Jobs funding went towards our youth jobs, library and literacy initiatives.
